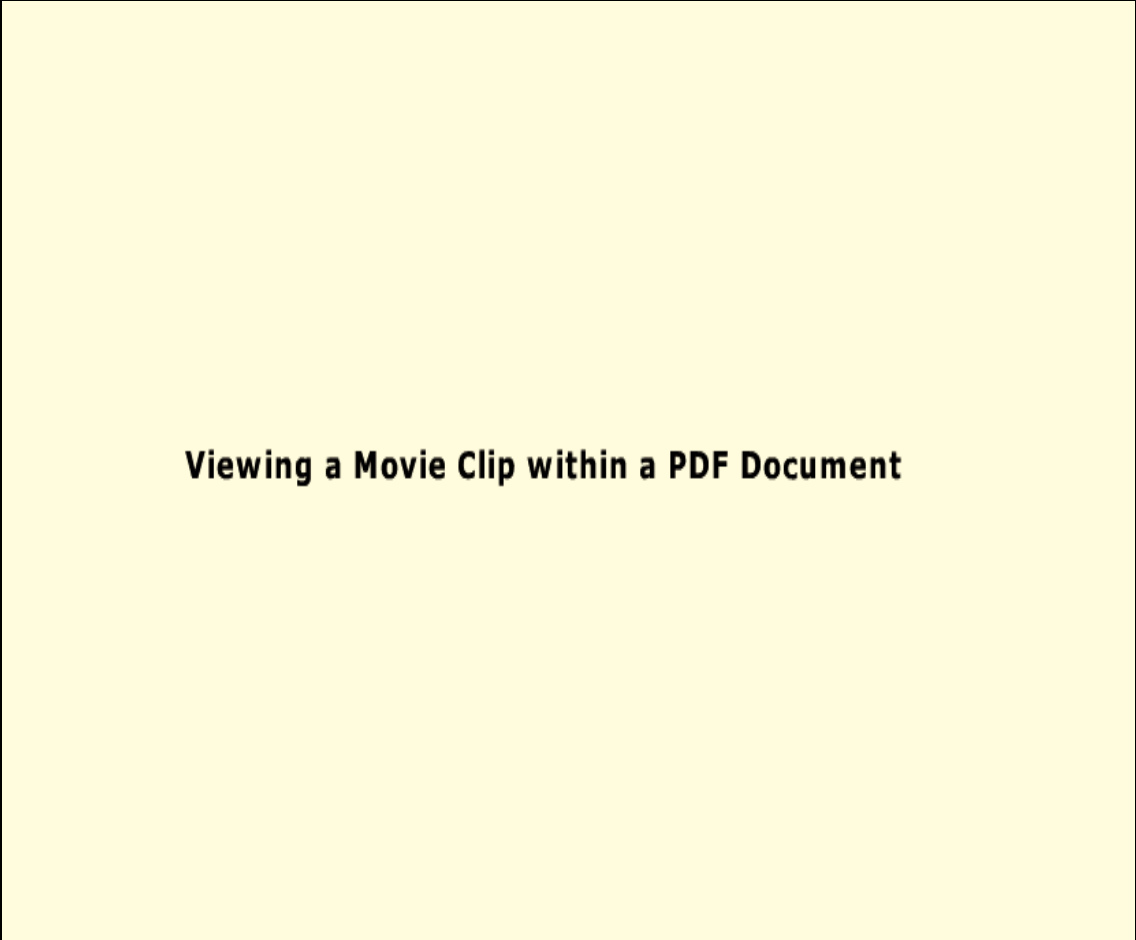


Adding Adobe Captivate Movie Clips to a PDF File
